In the Contraindications section, the following language concerning antipsychotic agents with α -blocking actions including butyrophenones and phenothiazines, and α -blockers should be revised (revised language is underlined):

Patients receiving the following agents:

Antipsychotic agents with α -blocking actions including butyrophenones and phenothiazines, and α -blockers (except when used for emergency treatment of anaphylactic shock)

In the Contraindications for Co-administration subsection of the Interactions section, the following language concerning antipsychotic agents or α blockers should be revised (revised language is underlined):

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Antipsychotic agents with α -blocking actions (butyrophenones, phenothiazines, iminodibenzyls, zotepine, risperidone) and α blockers [Clinical symptoms and measures: Hypotension may occur due to adrenaline reversal. Adrenaline should not be coadministered with antipsychotic agents with α -blocking actions except when used for emergency treatment of anaphylactic shock.]
